## Assessment:

The first semester of the Independent Study and Mentorship program was one of many changes and new experiences. Not only was this program new in the sense of professionalism and poise, but also in the sense of finding a topic that truly fit what I wanted to do in the future.

Beginning the year with a focus on veterinary sciences provided an introduction to the world of veterinary sciences.
